A Mighty Fortress Is Our God: A Litany for Reformation Sunday

This litany interweaves Martin Luther's great Reformation hymn with the words from Scripture that inspired it, the words of Psalm 46.

(Singing Hymn No. 275 as indicated)

LEADER: God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

PEOPLE: Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult

LEADER: There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High.

PEOPLE: God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns.

LEADER: The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; God speaks and the earth melts.

PEOPLE: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

THE FIRST SCRIPTURE LESSON: Galatians 2: 15-21...... Ben Cahoon, Liturgist

We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners; yet we know that a person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. And we have come to believe in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by doing the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law. But if, in our effort to be justified in Christ, we ourselves have been found to be sinners, is Christ then a servant of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again the very things that I once tore down, then I demonstrate that I am a transgressor. For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not nullify the grace of God; for if justification comes through the law, then Christ died for nothing.

THE SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON: Romans 1: 16-17, 3: 22b-28...... The Rev. Dr. Jody Moore

For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, 'The one who is righteous will live by faith.

For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus. Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

LEADER: This is the Word of the Lord.

The Reformation Sunday Affirmation of Faith on Grace, Faith, and Jesus Christ:

PEOPLE: Without my deserving it at all, out of sheer grace God grants and credits to me the perfect satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness of Christ. (From the Heidelberg Catechism)

LEADER: Let us thank God for grace.

PEOPLE: We thank you, God, for your grace. We thank you that you do not treat us as our sins deserve, that you do not repay us according to our iniquities.

LEADER: Let us thank God for faith. All we need to do is to accept this gift of God with a believing heart.

PEOPLE: We thank you, God, for the gift of faith. We thank you for faith that embraces Jesus Christ, with all his merits, and makes him its own, and no longer looks for anything apart from him. (From the Belgic Confession)

LEADER: The angel said to Joseph, "Give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Let us thank God for Jesus.

PEOPLE: Jesus saves us from our sins. We thank you, God, for Jesus. We thank you that we have in Jesus all that we need for our salvation. (From the Heidelberg Catechism)

Today's Affirmation of Faith quotes several passages of Scripture and the Heidelberg Catechism and the Belgic Confession, two sixteenth century affirmations of faith and may be found at www.reformedworship.org in an article by Adrian Dieleman. Our middle hymn, "I Greet Thee, Who My Sure Redeemer Art," is attributed to John Calvin.

Commemorating Martin Luther's 95 Thesis

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther's 95 Theses stated his objections to the practices and abuses of the church in his day and provided the first major step in the development of the Protestant Reformation. In commemoration of Luther nailing his 95 Theses to the door, we have a door in the sanctuary today that has been prepared for us by Jim Sias. On our door, there is a poster of Martin Luther and a list of the 95 Theses themselves. At the end of each row, there are baskets with post-it notes and pencils or pens. We invite you to pass the baskets down your aisle and take a post-it note and pen or pencil. You are invited to write on the post-it note either (1) something you want to thank God for doing or (2) something you resolve to do to help God, our community, or other people. At the appropriate time in the worship service, you are invited to come forward and put your post-it note on the door. We will plan to leave the door up until we decorate for Christmas so that you will have an opportunity to read the 95 Theses and the thoughts of all of our congregation members.

Pastor's Class on the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation

The Pastor will hold the final class on the Study of the Reformation tomorrow, Monday, October 30 at 5:15 pm. This Bible Study is in conjunction with celebrating the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. We will learn about Martin Luther, John Calvin, and the key theological concepts of the Reformation and its implications for Christians today.
