October has been a hectic month at Outer Banks Presbyterian Church. Thanks to everyone who participated in our meaningful classes on the Reformation on Tuesday afternoons. On the first Sunday of the month it was World Communion Sunday. The second Sunday we had new members join. The third Sunday we honored the music ministry program and recognized Jason Evans's tenth anniversary at OBPC. The fourth Sunday of October was Consecration Sunday. Thanks to those who have participated in Consecration Sunday by committing your time, talents, and financial gifts to the church in 2018. If you still haven't turned in your pledge card, I invite you to prayerfully consider what God may be calling you to give in 2018. The fifth Sunday of October was the celebration for the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. If you missed Reformation Sunday, throughout the month of November we are keeping up a door that we used in worship on Reformation Sunday. The door contains a poster of Martin Luther, the text of his *95 Theses*, and a number of inspirational post-it notes written by church members. Please take the time to stop by the door as a way to remember and honor our Reformed heritage.

November 5th is All Saints Day. We will be remembering the Reverend Richard Batzler and the four church members who have died over the past year during our morning worship service. We will light a candle in memory of each one of these five people that day. On All Saints Day, the word saint refers, not to perfect people, but to all Christians who have died and have been made right or justified before God because of Christ's death and resurrection. It has been a difficult year saying goodbye to some dear friends in our church, but All Saints Day points to our ultimate hope that we have in Jesus Christ for eternal life.

On Sunday November 19th, our congregation will host a Community Wide Thanksgiving Service at 4:00 pm. This is the fifth consecutive year that we will be hosting this meaningful event. The worship service is sponsored by the North Dare Ministerial Association and is a chance for people from congregations throughout the Outer Banks to come together to offer thanksgiving and praise to almighty God. Also on November 19th, we will have a luncheon immediately following the 10:00 am worship service. The luncheon is a joint effort by the Fellowship and Stewardship Committees as a way to thank God for all of the blessings that the Lord has given to us as individuals and as a congregation.

November 5, 2017
1st John 3:1-3, 23-24

John shares the amazing good news that our heavenly Father loves us so much that “we should be called children of God.” Our identity as God’s children has implications for who we are and how we live.
