



THE FIRST SCRIPTURE LESSON: James 3:13-17, 4:7-12 Jean Basnight, Liturgist

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy.

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. Lament and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned into mourning and your joy into dejection. Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you. Do not speak evil against one another, brothers and sisters. Whoever speaks evil against another or judges another, speaks evil against the law and judges the law; but if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. There is one lawgiver and judge who is able to save and to destroy. So who, then, are you to judge your neighbor?

THE SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON: James 3:5-12 The Rev. Dr. Jody Moore

So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of nature, and is itself set on fire by hell. For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.

ONE: It is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God.

ALL: **Without my deserving it at all, out of sheer grace God grants and credits to me the perfect satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness of Christ.** (From the Heidelberg Catechism)

ONE: Let us thank God for grace.

ALL: **We thank you, God, for your grace. We thank you that you do not treat us as our sins deserve, that you do not repay us according to our iniquities.**

ONE: Let us thank God for faith. All we need to do is to accept this gift of God with a believing heart.

ALL: **We thank you, God, for the gift of faith. We thank you for faith that embraces Jesus Christ, with all his merits, and makes him its own, and no longer looks for anything apart from him.** (From the Belgic Confession)

ONE: The angel said to Joseph, "Give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Let us thank God for Jesus.

ALL: **Jesus saves us from our sins. We thank you, God, for Jesus. We thank you that we have in Jesus all that we need for our salvation.** (From the Heidelberg Catechism)

Today we commemorate Luther nailing his 95 Theses to the door, which began the Reformation.
