A Word from our Pastor



November 4th will be All Saints Sunday, which is a meaningful day in the church year, especially for those who are remembering loved ones who have died. On All Saints Day, the word saint refers, not to perfect or especially exemplary people, but to all Christians who have died and have been made right or justified before God because of Christ's death and resurrection. This year for All Saints' Sunday, we will

read the names of three church members and friends who have died over the past year.

All Saints Day is a good time for us to talk about death. It is never an easy subject to bring up, but we in the church need to be open and honest about addressing death. While we grieve for loved ones who have died, as Christians we also have audacious hope because of Jesus Christ. One of my favorite statements about death comes from the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s document [A Declaration of Faith](#), which says, "Death will be destroyed. In the death of Jesus Christ, God's way in the world seemed finally defeated. But death was no match for God. The resurrection of Jesus was God's victory over death. Death often seems to prove that life is not worth living, that our best efforts and deepest affections go for nothing. We do not yet see the end of death. But Christ has been raised from the dead, transformed, and yet the same person. In his resurrection is the promise of ours. We are convinced the life God wills for each of us is stronger than the death that destroys us. The glory of that life exceeds our imagination, but we know we shall be with Christ. So we treat death as a broken power. Its ultimate defeat is certain. In the face of death we grieve. Yet in hope we celebrate life. No life ends so tragically that its meaning and value are destroyed. Nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord."

On Sunday November 18th, our congregation will host a community-wide Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service at 4:00 pm. This is the sixth consecutive year that we will be hosting this meaningful event. The worship service is sponsored by the North Dare Ministerial Association and is a chance for people from congregations throughout the Outer Banks to come together to offer thanksgiving and praise to almighty God. This is one of the most meaningful services of the year and we need your help to get the word out by inviting your friends and neighbors. Our secretary, Cathie Feild, has created a poster to help advertise the event---if you are willing to put up one of the posters somewhere in the community, you may pick up a poster in the church office.

Also on November 18th, we will have a luncheon immediately following the 10:00 am worship service. The luncheon is a joint effort by the Fellowship and Stewardship & Generosity Committees as a way to thank God for all of the blessings that the Lord has given to us as individuals and as a congregation. As we discussed during this fall's stewardship season, developing a sense of gratitude is connected to generosity. When we reflect on the many ways that God has blessed us, it makes us grateful. A tangible way that we can show our gratitude or thankfulness is more giving back. I want to especially thank all those who have pledged their time, talents, and resources for the work of God's kingdom and for Christ's glory.

November 4, 2018

All Saints' Sunday
John 11

Jesus' close friend Lazarus has died and has been in the grave for four days. Jesus weeps for his friend and then does something miraculous. Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead and brings him back to life. Jesus tells us that he can bring us new life because he is the resurrection and the life. On this All Saints' Sunday, we will focus on our hope in Christ's resurrection power.

November 11, 2018

The 25th Sunday after Pentecost
Psalm 46

The psalmist speaks to the ways that God provides comfort and strength, especially in the times when we are tested. When the nations are in uproar, God is with us and the Lord can make wars cease. We trust in God as the source of our peace. On this 100th anniversary of the end of World War I, which led to the establishment of Armistice Day, we will recognize our veterans in worship.

November 18, 2018

The 26th Sunday after Pentecost
1st Samuel 1:4-20

Hannah wants to have a child, but she is barren. She prays to God and promises that if she has a child, she will dedicate that child to serve the Lord. God hears her prayer and Hannah gives birth to a son named Samuel. Hannah is deeply moved with gratitude. On this Sunday before Thanksgiving, for what do we have to be thankful? Why is it important for us to live as grateful people?

News from the October 2018 Stated Session Meeting

Nomination of Elders, Class of 2021

At the Called Congregational Meeting on October 7, 2018, members unanimously approved the nomination of Dan Broadhead, Ron Campbell, and Ike McRee as the Elders, Class of 2021.

These nominees will participate in several orientation sessions, led by Jody, and be examined for their role as Ruling Elders in December.

OCTOBER STATED SESSION MEETING

Session approved the requests for:

- OBPC to host the North Dare Ministerial Association (NDMA) Meeting on Tuesday, November 6, 2018 at 8 am;
- NDMA to hold the Community Thanksgiving Service at OBPC on November 18, 2018 at 4:00 pm;
- Memberships of Don and Donna Frye to be transferred to the Centenary United Methodist Church of New Bern, NC;
- OBPC internal groups, (e.g. the OBPC Music Ministry, Youth Group, AA, Scouts, and North Dare Ministerial Association), to proceed with usual activities if there are no conflicts on the church calendar.

However, activities explicitly for major fundraising, (e.g. yard sales or pancake suppers), or by external groups, (i.e. musical performances by guest artists), do need Session approval.

Session discussed:

- The participation of our church in Hurricane Florence relief plans through the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program and the Presbytery of New Hope:
 1. Preparing Buckets with supplies to be used for cleanup;
 2. Financial contributions; and
 3. Sign up of volunteers to help with reconstruction efforts at some time in the future.
- Jody's request that all Elder Liaisons check with their respective Committee Moderators:
 1. To clarify who will continue as moderators in 2019 or to recommend who is willing to become the moderator; and

2. To submit the committees' 2019 budget requests to the Finance Committee by November 15, 2018 on the form provided.

- The Stewardship & Generosity Committee's initiative to provide ways that money may be given to the OBPC online; Session approved a motion to submit the "Presbyterian Foundation Online Giving Fund Application."
- The Building and Grounds Committee reported satisfaction with the installation of the new southside windows.

Library Hours

The library is available to read or find books anytime during the week when the church office is open (Monday-Thursday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm). On Sundays, the library is open from 9:45-10:00 am and after worship from 11-11:30 am.



Each year, our youth group packages shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child sponsored by Samaritan's Purse. The story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37) gives a clear picture of God's desire for us to help those in desperate need wherever we find them. After describing how the Samaritan rescued a hurting man whom others had passed by, Jesus told His hearers, "Go and do likewise." For over 40 years, Samaritan's Purse has tried to follow Christ's command by going to the aid of the world's poor, sick, and suffering. They are an effective means of reaching hurting people in countries around the world with food, medicine, and other assistance in the Name of Jesus Christ. Operation Christmas Child is just one way we can support this ministry.

On Sunday, November 4 the youth will be shopping at Dollar Tree to fill their own shoeboxes, then will return to church to wrap and package all the shoeboxes for National Collection Week. Please prayerfully consider on of the following ways you can join us in this ministry:

- 1) Shop with us at Dollar Tree (the new location in front of Harris Teeter) on Sunday, November 4 at 4:30 PM, then return to church to package your shoebox for shipping.
- 2) Donate \$9 to cover the shipping cost of a shoebox. Donations may be given to Hollie or any youth member, or placed in the offering and marked "Operation Christmas Child."
- 3) Donate items for shoeboxes. A list of suggested items (and prohibited items) is below. We will be collecting items throughout the month of October. A donation box is located in the Gathering Space.
- 4) Pray for the children who will receive these Christmas shoeboxes, and all those involved in the Operation Christmas Child ministry.

Prohibited items:

Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

Suggested items (for children ages 2-14):

- plastic shoeboxes with lids
- stuffed animals
- figurines
- dolls
- small toys and musical instruments (balls, yo-yos, harmonicas, slinky)
- clothing (socks, underwear, sunglasses, hats, t-shirts)
- toiletries & linens (bar soap, washcloth, toothbrush, deodorant, comb, hairbrush, hygiene products)
- school supplies (pencils, notebooks, markers, crayons, coloring books, glue sticks)
- craft supplies (play-doh, sewing kit, yarn, beads)

Ike McRee




